

Increased Security – Update

CLARIFICATION OF 'LIQUIDS, GELS AND PASTES'

This update seeks to clarify in more detail the items which are and are not permitted through the airport security search point and onto aircraft.

General



Liquids, gels and pastes may NOT be taken through the airport security search point and onto aircraft, except:

- Baby milk or baby food which has been proved safe by having been tasted by the passenger;
- Essential, prescription (or children's) liquid medicine (under 50ml) which has been verified as safe by being tasted by the passenger or examined by an airport pharmacist.



Specific examples

- The table below lists some of the items which may and may not be taken through the airport security search point and onto aircraft.
- Please note that the list is not exhaustive. If any item is not on the list, then the general rule described above applies.


Drinks

Cosmetics

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lip gloss in containers or pots• Liquid foundations• Liquid eyeliners• Liquid eye shadows• Mascara• Lip balm in pots• Nail varnish	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Powder-based foundations• Compact-based foundations• Powder-based eye shadows• Lipsticks• Chap sticks• Lip balms in solid form• Eye pencils



Toiletries

NOT PERMITTED 	PERMITTED 
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Foam• Gels• Hairsprays• Shower gels• Deodorant aerosols• Deodorant roll-on• Perfumes• Aftershave• Liquid, gel or paste-based hair products• Lotions• Creams• Sun tanning products• Toothpaste	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Solid forms of toiletries• Deodorant sticks in solid form• Soaps• Talcum powder



Food

NOT PERMITTED 	PERMITTED 
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Any liquid-based food products in packets, tubes, plastic or tin containers• Pasta or any other foodstuffs in sauces, gravies or other liquids• Jams and syrups• Sauces• Pastes• Yoghurts• Soups (carton or otherwise)• Stews• Curry	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Sandwiches• Crisps• Fruit• Vegetables• Other solid foods

Writing implements

NOT PERMITTED 	PERMITTED 
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Spare cartridges for fountain pens	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Biro• Gel pens• Fountain pens (but no refills)• Rollerball pens• Pencils

Baby milk/baby food

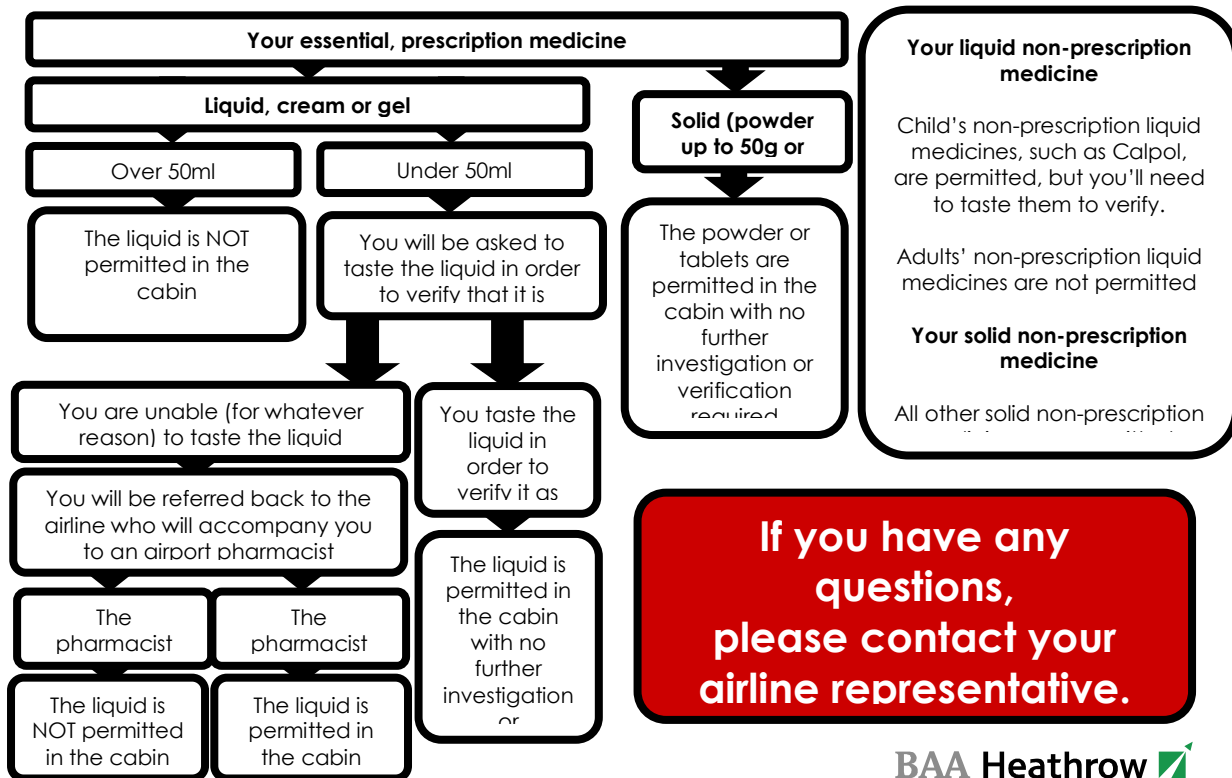
NOT PERMITTED 	PERMITTED 
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bottles, beakers, or flasks containing water 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Empty containers such as empty bottles beakers or flasks • Baby milk (if tasted by the passenger) • Baby juice (if tasted by the passenger) • Baby food in liquid, gel or paste form (if tasted by the passenger) • Baby food powder (need not be tasted)
