BRITISH AIRWAYS LAUNCHES NEW DIRECT FLIGHT FROM LONDON HEATHROW TO SEOUL



The new Seoul (ICN) service begins on December 2, 2012 from London Heathrow Terminal 5. A four cabin Boeing 777, with the new First, Club World (business class), World Traveller Plus (premium economy) and World Traveller (economy) cabins, will serve the six flights a week to Seoul.

The in-flight meal service includes a three-course meal, including a Korean option, as well as a complimentary bar service.

The outbound flight to Seoul arrives at the beginning of the working day there and the flights have been timed in order to allow convenient connections to British Airways' extensive domestic and European short haul network to and from Heathrow.

AMERICAN AIRLINES ANNOUNCES NEW NON-STOP SERVICE BETWEEN DUBLIN (DUB) AND NEW YORK (JFK)



The new service will start on 12 June 2013, subject to government approval, and will be available for sale from 5 November, this year. With a departure time of 09:00 from Dublin it means that this new service will be the first flight leaving Ireland for New York (JFK) each day and will be available throughout the year. This will provide excellent onward connections, opening up the United States, Latin America and the Caribbean to our Irish customers.

Our Joint Business partner American Airlines has also announced

the launch of new services to markets in Europe, Asia and Latin America, as well as an additional service from Dallas/Fort Worth and Chicago.

NEW PRODUCT INVESTMENT FOR BRITISH AIRWAYS LONDON TO SYDNEY ROUTE

From 31 March 2013 British Airways flights between London Heathrow, Singapore and Sydney will move from London Heathrow's Terminal 3 to the airline's award-winning home in Terminal 5.

The London to Sydney route will be operated by British Airways' newest aircraft, the Boeing 777-300ER, offering the airline's latest on board cabin design in First, Club World (business class) – voted World's Best Business Class at the 2012 Business Traveller Awards, World Traveller Plus (premium economy) and World Traveller (economy).

The aircraft also offers the airline's newest inflight entertainment system, offering up to 50 per cent more movies and doubling the number of TV and music options.

British Airways' other Singapore service – BA011 from London and BA012 from Singapore – will continue to operate using a Boeing 747-400 aircraft.





WINTER 2012: DUB AND TBS FREQUENCY CHANGES

CANCELLATION OF LONDON GATWICK TO MANCHESTER SERVICE

British Airways is withdrawing its London Gatwick to Manchester service from next summer. The commercial decision to suspend the service will be effective from 31 March 2013. However, air links between Manchester and London will be retained, with up to 11 return flights a day to Heathrow.

PAID SEATING ON AA OPERATED FLIGHTS

British Airways customers booked on American Airlines operated flights, either on AA prime or BA*AA codeshares, may now book and pay for AA's Paid Seating via ba.com Manage My Booking (MMB). The option to book seats on AA operated flights will be displayed when the customer retrieves their booking on MMB. If the customer selects this option, they will automatically be linked through to AA.com where they will be able to choose seats and pay online. For eligible customers (Premium and Full Fare), the seat booking option will remain free of charge.

SELF SERVICE BAG TAGGING AT LONDON HEATHROW T3

Our customers are now able to use Self Service Bag Tag at London Heathrow Terminal 3. This excellent option allows customers to print and attach bag tags at a self-service kiosk. The customer then drops their bag at a bag drop desk. As well as easing congestion on the airport concourse, it adds extra speed, efficiency and convenience to your British Airways travel.
